





PROGRAM

Learning Objectives:

At the conclusion of the activity, the participant should be able to:

- Develop a systemic approach to the pathologic diagnosis of tumors of the GU system
- Improve the effectiveness of using immunohistochemical markers in differential diagnosis and classification of tumors of the GU system
- Learn new developments in molecular and genomic tests as prognostic and predictive markers for prostate and bladder cancers
- Recognize the strength and weakness of various molecular tests
- Discuss how to interpret renal biopsies for kidney tumors with immunohistochemical stains
- Discuss pathologists' role on watchful and waiting protocol of prostate biopsies

Needs Assessment: Pathology practice in tumors of the genitourinary (GU) system is undergoing dramatic changes. A variety of new disease entities were introduced in the 2022 WHO Classification of Tumors of the GU System. To improve clinical practice, pathologists need to be familiar with these new entities. Molecular test has become an integral part of GU pathology daily practice with a rapidly expanding test menu. To take full advantage of the new technology, pathologists need to be familiar with the strength and weakness of various molecular tests. These professional practice gaps will be addressed through highly focused lectures and translated to clinical practice with case-based discussions. Didactic sessions will allow participants to expand their knowledge, increase their competence and improve management performance.

Target Audience: This activity is designed for physicians, educators, fellows and residents, physicians assistants, and any other health care professionals.

Educational Methods: The program format will consist of didactic lectures with Q&A and discussions. Handouts will be provided.

Evaluation: Evaluation by questionnaire will address program content, presentation, and possible bias.
